Introduction

- Cold chain is a concept of connecting production, storage, processing, distribution in cold.
- ◆ Food losses occur mostly during the early and middle stage of the food supply chain because of the lack of sufficient cold chain.
- Establishing and upgrading cold chain contributes to reducing food losses, which leads to achieve food security.

Introduction

The sufficient cold chain enables small farmers and fishers to develop value-added food products.

 Cold chain is also necessary to fulfill the demand of diversified diet.


- ◆ Cold chains' challenges, experiences, and lessons from business sector were shared.
